The Summit will summarize the latest research findings about the relationship between local air pollution and asthma prevalence, severity and disease control among our region's schoolchildren. The Keynote Lecture will focus on the effect of prenatal exposure to air pollution on childhood asthma. The Summit will also address public health measures and the use of emerging technology to monitor and improve health outcomes related to air pollution.
