As addiction and opioid overdose continue to be a problem, it is becoming increasingly more important for pharmacists to appropriately dispense pain medications per the guidelines for those who truly need them. Also, community pharmacists now play an integral role in the distribution of naloxone rescue to those who need it. This course will equip pharmacists with the tools needed to train patients at the time of dispensing on the use of naloxone and when its use is indicated.
