Symposium Description

As rates of opioid use and abuse continue to rise, healthcare providers are on the forefront of the battle. They should be equipped with the tools to aid patients in evidence-based use of opioid and non-opioid pain management strategies as well as identifying patients who may be struggling with addiction. This symposium will provide practitioners with the knowledge and skills necessary to effectively manage patient's pain while effectively minimizing risk to the patient. Participants will have active, case-based learning to apply their knowledge and skills to real life patient scenarios.

Who Should Attend

The target audience includes, pharmacists, physicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, addiction counselors and other health care professionals with an interest in addiction and pain management.
