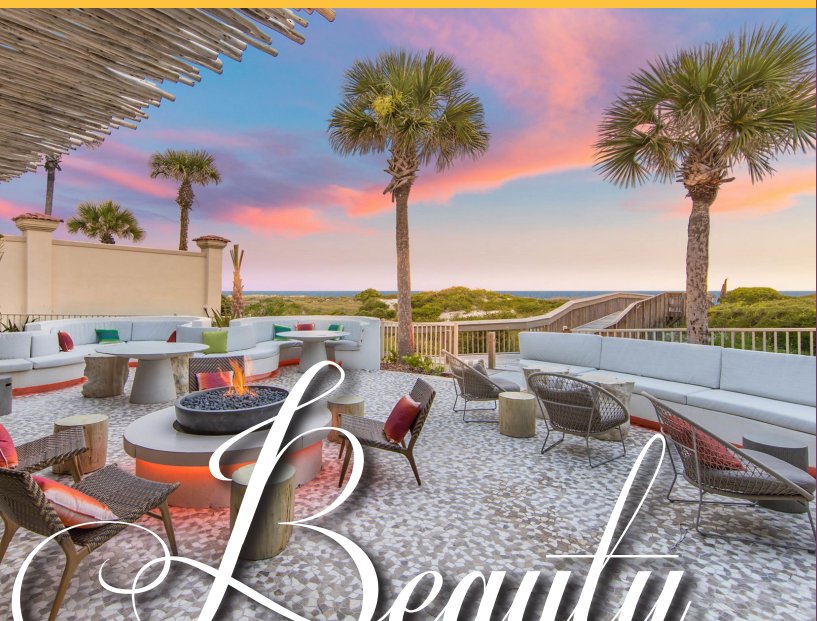

Michael M. Demo, DDS

Dr. Demo attended the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill for undergraduate and dental school, where he graduated with highest honors and distinction in 2008. He completed his Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery residency training at Emory University and its affiliated hospital including Emory University Hospital in 2012. Andrew Currie, DMD

After graduating from the University of Louisville School of Dentistry in 2010, Dr. Andrew Currie completed a two-year, implant and surgery focused, GPR at the Medical College of Georgia (now the Dental College of Georgia at Augusta University). For the past 11 years, he has dedicated his private practice almost exclusively to implant dentistry, and he handles most of the large surgical cases for his 5 office locations. Teaching has been a passion of Dr. Currie's since 2012, and he lectures on guided surgery, implant prosthetics, digital dentistry, 3D printing, and surgical dentistry. Dr. Currie is a Diplomate in the International Congress of Oral Implantologists and is adjunct faculty in his former residency.

Brian Lindke, CDT

Brian has studied with many world renowned clinicians and technicians and maintains membership in several prestigious organizations including: The Kois Center, Spear Academy, Academy of Osseointegration, International Congress of Oral Implantologists, American College of Prosthodontists, American Academy of Restorative Dentistry, American Academy of Cosmetic Dentistry, Georgia Academy of Cosmetic Dentistry.

He is a Recognized Specialist at the Kois Center and a founding board member of Kois Study Club Atlanta; founder of The Digital Reality study club of Atlanta; and the current past President of the Georgia Academy of Cosmetic Dentistry. Brian has presented lectures and hands-on courses nationally and internationally to dentists and technicians for more than 29 years.

Shiven Gandhi, DMD

Dr. Shiven Gandhi is a native of Atlanta, Georgia. He attended the University of Alabama at Birmingham to receive his bachelors in biology. He received his D.M.D. degree at the Dental College of Georgia at Augusta University. After graduating in 2013, he continued his education in dentistry with a two year hospital-based General Practice Residency. During the two year residency Dr. Gandhi became proficient in implant placement and restoration, IV conscious sedation, wisdom teeth extractions, and treating medically complex patients. Dr. Gandhi stays active in giving back to the profession and is an adjunct faculty instructor at the Dental College of Georgia in Augusta. Dr. Gandhi strives to provide responsible esthetics and implant dentistry. He has taken various continuing education courses to further his esthetics training including Spear Education, Dentlit Academy, and is an active member of the AACD, the American Academy of Cosmetic Dentistry. Dr. Gandhi also lectures on various topics including dental photography, Botox therapy in dentistry, and also teaches hands-on implant placement in various training courses across the US.

Stephanie Wetzel, DDS

Dr. Wetzel is a Montana native and earned her bachelor's degree from Montana State University. She attended the University of Minnesota School of Dentistry to obtain her Doctor of Dental Surgery. THAT LOOKS BAD! IDENTIFYING MALIGNANT LESIONS OF THE ORAL CAVITY

Thousands of cases of oral cancer occur in the United States each year. However, there is a significant delay in the time of onset of disease to the time of diagnosis. This leads to poor outcomes for patients suffering from oral cancer. The key to improving prognosis is early detection. Dentist and members of their staff are typically the first health care providers to see these lesions. Therefore, their awareness and ability to identify worrisome lesions is of utmost importance in the battle against oral cancer.
