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Leonard "Lenny" Feldman, M.D., SFHM, FAAP, FACP is an Associate Professor in Internal Medicine and Pediatrics and a hospitalist in the Division of Hospitalist Medicine at Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine since 2004. He received his undergraduate degree at Brown University and his medical degree from the University of Maryland School of Medicine. He completed his combined Internal Medicine-Pediatrics residency at the University of North Carolina, where he served as a chief resident for the Internal Medicine residency.

He is the founder and program director of the Johns Hopkins Combined Internal Medicine-Pediatrics Urban Health Residency and the Osler Urban Health Internal Medicine Primary Care Track. He is also an associate program director for the Osler Internal Medicine Residency.

As a hospitalist, program builder, and a specialist in resident and hospitalist education, Dr. Feldman has focused his research on urban health, resident education, on-line education, and high-value care. Other interests include patient education, consult medicine, evidence-based medicine, and quality improvement. He is the editor-in-chief for SHM Consultative and Perioperative Medicine Essentials for Hospitalists and a Deputy Editor for the Journal of Hospital Medicine for the "Things We Do For No Reason" series.
