GUEST FACULTY

MATTHEW W. WILSON, MD, FACS, is the Barrett G. Haik Endowed Chair for the Department of Ophthalmology in the College of Medicine at the University of Tennessee Health Science Center and director of the Hamilton Eye Institute. Dr. Wilson obtained his undergraduate degree in biology from Furman University in Greenville, South Carolina. He earned his medical degree from Emory University in Atlanta in 1990 and completed his internal medicine internship, ophthalmology residency, and a fellowship in ophthalmic pathology at Emory University. He also completed fellowships in ocular oncology at Saint Bartholomew's and Moorefield's Eye Hospital in London, England, and ophthalmic plastic and reconstructive surgery from Casey Eye Institute in Portland, Oregon.

He has authored over 190 peer-reviewed publications and over 25 book chapters. His service to the ophthalmic community earned him the Lifetime Achievement Award from the American Academy of Ophthalmology in 2018.

In 2013, he was named Chief of Ophthalmology at St. Jude Children's Research Hospital and in 2018 was named St. Jude's Director of Global Retinoblastoma. Dr. Wilson also serves on the Board of Trustees for Furman University.
