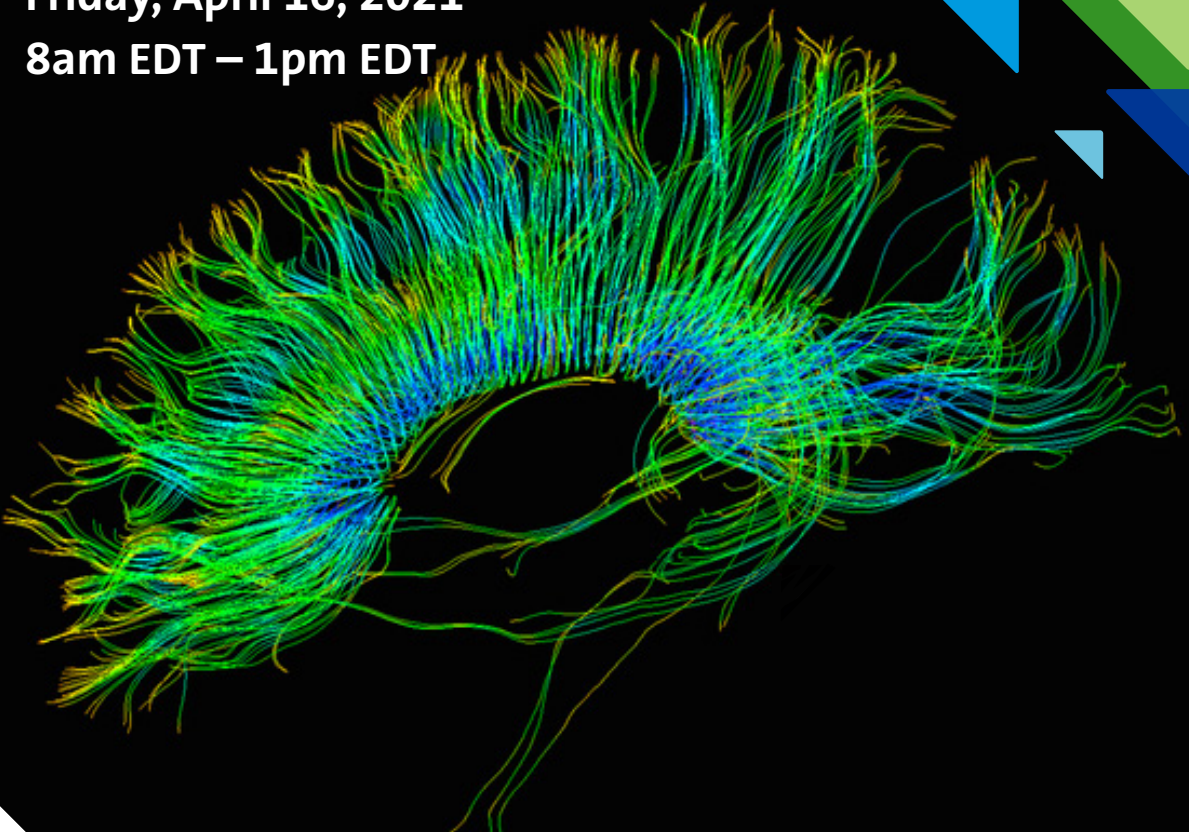

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Statement of Need: Although many practitioners take neurotrauma call, fewer have chosen to specialize in the complete care of traumatic brain and spinal cord injury and may be unfamiliar with the nuances of their complex management.

Recently published guidelines on the management of severe pediatric TBI are not widely known and this program will highlight some of the changes in management that have occurred since the last publication approximately 10 years ago.

There is a need to increase awareness of options to treat disorders of consciousness in the acute and subacute care of TBI. Practitioners may not exhibit sufficient comfort or knowledge as to which neurostimulants are appropriate for which stages of TBI recovery.

Program Objectives: Best treatments for spinal cord injury patients including early surgery and hemodynamic support.

- **Assess** treatment paradigms for children with severe traumatic brain injury.
- **Discuss** management strategies in cranial and spinal trauma through case-based examples and panel discussion.

Target Audience: MDs, DOs, PAs, NPs, RNs, EMTs; residents; medical and nursing students and all members of the healthcare team interested in cerebrovascular disease
