Statement of Need: The diagnosis and treatment of gastrointestinal and liver disorders has advanced rapidly. The downside of this rapid pace is that many providers, both in the community and even those in teaching centers, find it difficult to keep up with these advances. Consequently, patients may have inadequate access to the most up to date care.
