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Statement of Need: Pregnancies can be a state of high risk for both pregnant person and fetus. In Nassau County alone, high risk events in pregnancy account for a maternal mortality rate of 11.7/100,000. Additionally, perinatal mortality plus fetal deaths, rate at 3.3 per 1,000 live births, with an infant mortality rate of 2.9 per 1,000 live births. Complications of pregnancy can be mitigated with early intervention, treatment, appropriate referral to subspecialties and multidisciplinary team effort. This conference will address the most current screening techniques for assessing for fetal anomalies and maternal complications of pregnancy. In addition, gaps in knowledge regarding high-risk pregnancy complications most seen to date, as well as the best and latest approaches for detecting, treating, and managing newborns with surgical conditions, will be addressed.

Describe elements and details of diagnoses of fetal conditions requiring surgery.
