

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
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Statement of need: Wounds occur due to many different etiologies and underlying disease processes. New technologies, treatments, techniques, and protocols are continuously developed for inpatient and outpatient locations and require ongoing education to maintain knowledge and skills. Deficiency of such, may lead to slower healing rates and poorer patient outcomes. Wound care is multidisciplinary in nature, thus requiring an allencompassing educational opportunity that is not specific to one specialty, but capable of disseminating current information to all. Whereas specific discipline related education may not include this multidisciplinary content nor have focused content on this subject.
