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Statement of Need: Heavy Menstrual Bleeding (HMB) is an underrecognized and debilitating condition with high direct and indirect costs.

Clinical providers and healthcare professionals from different disciplines who care for girls and women with HMB should recognize this condition including screening for inherited bleeding disorders and prevent consequences of ongoing bleeding. In addition, providers need to gain competency and skills to appropriately diagnose, manage this condition, and know when to refer to the different specialties. This activity will review the need to recognize HMB, its causes, optimize care, identify community resources, and refer to the appropriate specialty.
