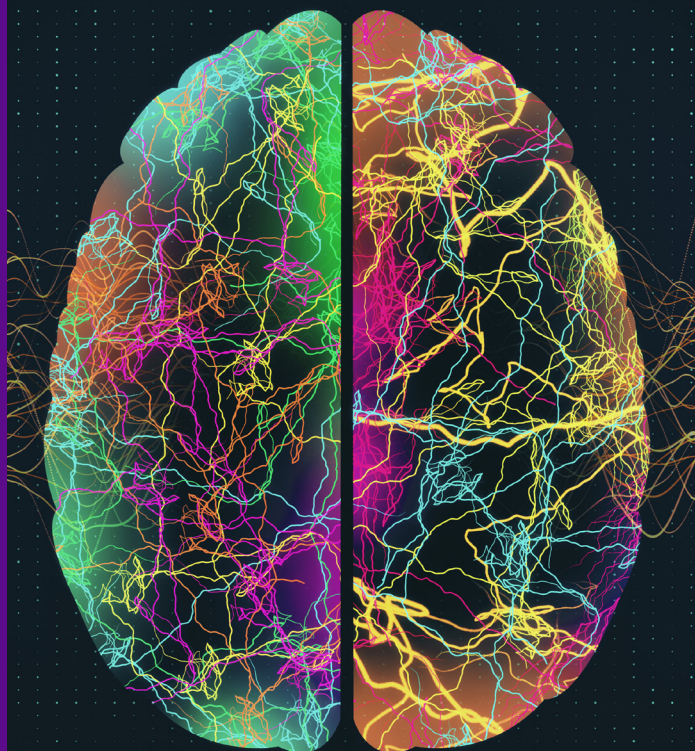

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Statement of Need: Knowledge deficit affects the proper treatment and evaluation of patients with neurological disorders such as stroke, epilepsy, neuromuscular diseases, multiple sclerosis, Alzheimer's, and Parkinson's disease. These diseases are common in the general population, and they are a major cause of disability, especially among older individuals. The medical care of patients with neurological disorders is often provided by primary care and family physicians, internists, geriatricians, and other non-neurologists. As knowledge in neuroscience is rapidly growing, novel diagnostic tools and treatment interventions have been developed that have significantly improved the care of neurological patients. This educational program will inform participants of best practice and novel interventions for neurological disorders, addressing the knowledge and practice gap of non-neurologists caring for neurological disorders.

Program objectives: All Northwell Health CME activities are intended to improve patient care, safety, and outcomes. At the conclusion of this conference, participants should be able to:

- **Identify** new treatment parameters and novel treatment strategies for patients with neurological disorders.
- **Revise** clinical practice, incorporating knowledge presented in the educational activity to implement state-of-the-art and evidence-based treatment management of patients with neurological disorders.
- **Utilize** updated evidence-based treatments for neurological disorders.

Target audience: This activity was planned by and for physicians, nurses, physician assistants and psychologists. All other members of the health care team who are interested in the care and treatment of neurological disorders are welcome to attend.
