This session will include a glimpse into a day at a Social Adult Day Program facilitated by two local programs: Long Island Alzheimer's and Dementia Center and Sid Jacobson JCC. Learners will have the opportunity to try some typical activities offered daily such as art therapy, brain training trivia and physical exercises, while learning about how such programs provide respite and support for caregivers and engagement to people living with dementia to help increase quality of life.

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Statement of need: There is a general underestimation of the relevance and impact of dementia, both as a clinical entity and societal burden. Our health systems are not equipped to manage dementia; from the diagnosis to the overall management, they lack coordinated programs to manage the patients and support the caregivers. There is a great knowledge gap regarding novel and advanced diagnostic strategies, as well as experimental approaches, research and clinical trials available in our region for these patients. This activity is designed to educate the wider community of health care providers, patients and caregivers about the presentation and approach to the diagnosis, treatment and management of dementia.

Program objectives: All Northwell Health CME activities are intended to improve patient care, safety and outcomes. At the conclusion of this conference, participants should be able to:

— **Recognize** and classify patients affected by dementia. This will translate into an increased number of referrals to general practitioners, neurologists, geriatricians and recognition earlier in the disease process.

— **Utilize** the diagnostic resources available in the health system and beyond to obtain an accurate differential diagnosis. This will translate into more accurate diagnosis and consideration of differential diagnoses.

— **Create** effective strategies to manage patients. Overall, this will translate into better management of dementia patients and reduced burden on their caregivers.

Target audience: This program is designed for physicians, psychologists, nurses, pharmacists and more widely, to the greater community of patients and caregivers who can benefit to understand how these practices are integrated in our system.
